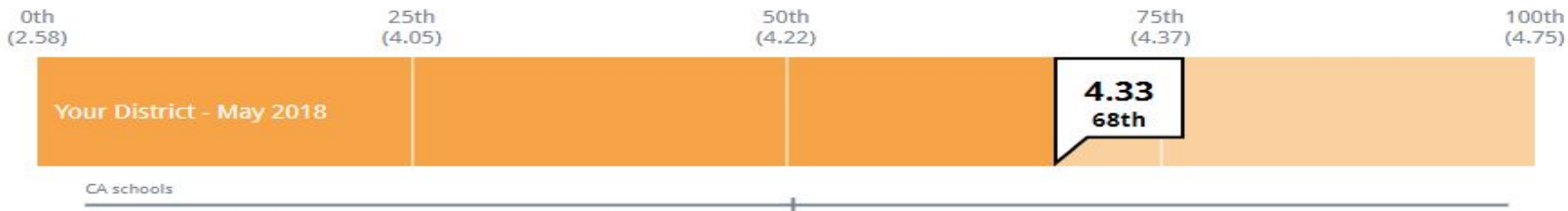

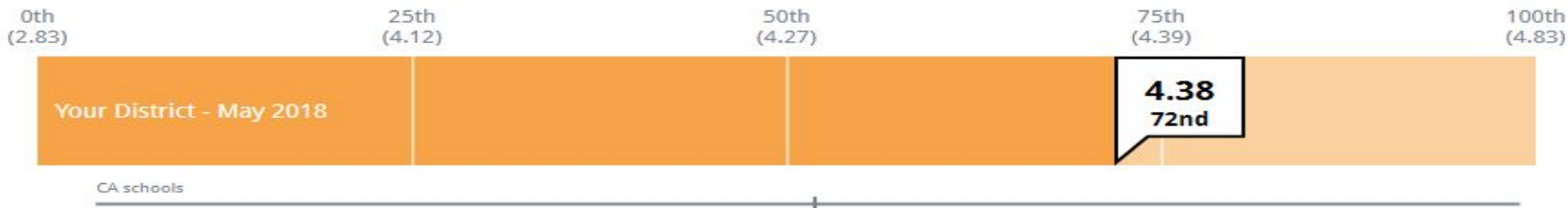

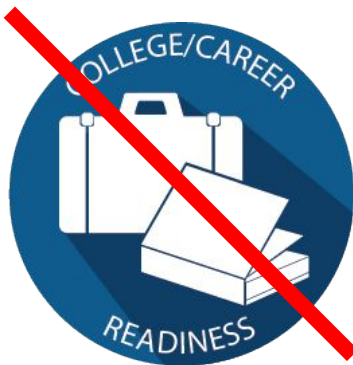
Teachers and students care about each other.
